Events and remarks transcribed from quartermaster record by Navigator.

0000-0400

Underway on various courses at 6 knots in company with Task Group 51.8 in position #42, circling 25 miles off the Southern Beach of Okinawa, Ryukyu Isl., with radar and degaussing in operation. Flares and gun flashes observed over the island. The following course changes were made: 0000, 167°T (165°PGC); 0030, 122°T (120°PGC); 0100, 077°T (075°PGC); 0130, 032°T (030°PGC); 0200, 347°T (345°PGC); 0230, 302°T (300°PGC).

Underway as before on course 302°T, 7 knots (180 RPM). 0415 c/s to 8 K. 0500 c/s to 5 K. 0508 c/s to 3 K. 0521 Sounded general quarters; all stations manned and ready in eight (8) minutes. 0544 c/c to 347°T (345°PGC). 0548 Enemy planes reported in immediate vicinity. minutes. 0544 c/c to 347°T (345°PGC). 0548 Enemy planes reported in immediate vicinity. 0548-30 All port guns opened fire at plane. 0549 Suicide plane (Japanese) crashed into port side at the waterline just forward of the superstructure, frame 32. Ship immediately caught fire and ammunition on the tank deck began to explode. Plane crashed through shipfitters shop and unexploded bomb fell down main engineroom trunk. Fire reported in main engine room. 0554 Exploding ammunition and fire deemed out of control. Made preparations for abandoning ship. Lowered stbd boat to pick up two men in water. 0554 Fire in main engine room under control, however heat and smoke continuing to increase. 0555 Order given to bandon ship. Lowered port boat, launched all rafts. 0600 Secured main engines and auziliary engines. Main engine room filled with acrid fumes and smoke. 0605 All engines secured and all men departed engine rooms. Auxiliary engine room overhead plating red hot. After as complete a check as possible all hands were reported off the ship; Commanding Officer went over the side into IST(M) 678's small boat. As far as could be ascertained all hands in the water were picked up by the various ships stending by to render assistance, IST(M) 678, IST 838, DD 656, ATR 80. 0730 A call was issued by C.O. to IST 884's ship's company aboard IST(M) 678 for volunteers to return to the ship and fight the fire, C.O. then aboard DD 656, observing from close aboard 884. ATR 80 approached side of ship and attempted to play hose on fire and was unsuccessful. The following men volunteered and returned.

Laying to dead in the water fighting fire aboard ship, 6 miles south east of Okinawa Isl., R.I. LCS 116, 118, and 119 laying alongside assisting in fighting fire. Ammunition on tank deck burning and exploding; fire working aft through the compartments toward 4011 magazines.Officers country completely burned on the portside, along with the galley and after main deck passageway. Attempting to flood tank deck and after crews quarters through main deck vents and cargo hatch to control fire. Fire cannot be fought from below decke because of exploding ammunition.

1400 USS AT-94 (USS YUMA) took ship in tow and proceeded to Kerama Retto, R.I. Started pumping water from aft starboard compartments to remove starboard list. .600-2000 Underway as before in tow. 1738 Passed through nets at entrance to Kerama Retto, R.I. 1938 Anchored by stern anchor in unknown depth of water to 500 ft. of cable. Set security watch. LCS 56 came alongside stbd side and fed crew. Attempted to ascertain whereabouts and status of remainder of crew by dispatch to Group Comdr. and to LST 638 and DD 656, unable to contact any of them. 000-2400 Anchored as before. 2230 Security watch reported Japanese swimmers in the water shooting at the ship. 2315 FLOCKENCIER, Forest D. (249-148) MoMMIc shot in the neck and killed and McCLELLAN, Hagness H. (640-885) Slc(QM) shot in both arms and wounded while raising embarkation nets on port bow, in an attempt to repel a Japanese boarding party. GEIST, A., Lieut.(jg), USCGR
